What is HAE?

Hereditary angioedema (HAE) is a rare genetic disease that can cause attacks of swelling, which can be painful, disabling, and potentially life-threatening.

Where can HAE attacks occur?

Swelling attacks can occur in various parts of the body.

Upper airway

Swelling in the throat can block the airway, creating a potentially life-threatening situation.

Skin/tissue under the skin

Typically affects the face, extremities, and genitals.

Digestive tract

Can cause mild to severe abdominal pain, vomiting, and diarrhea.

HAE Attack Triggers

• Surgery or dental procedures

Attacks can often occur without warning, but they are sometimes set off by a trigger. Triggers may include:

Emotional stress

Infection

Mechanical trauma

Physical trauma

• Hormonal influence

Medications

Medical/Dental Procedures and HAE

Some patients may experience an HAE attack **before**, **during**, or even **after** medical or dental procedures. Prior to the start of a procedure, please verify with the patient that they are not currently experiencing symptoms of an attack.



Please note, an HAE attack can be a serious and potentially life-threatening situation requiring immediate emergency care.
